There will be NZSL Interpreter for the whole camp. The close off date for applications to go to this camp was 15 March 2020.



Johanna – Please pray for continued healing


Fiona There are 3 special needs people in Fiona's family. Please pray that all their needs can be taken care of at home.

Parable (story) of the Nobleman's Servants

Also known as the Parable of the Seed

From Holy Bible, English Version for the Deaf

Luke 19 v 11-27

¹¹ Jesus travelled closer to Jerusalem. Some people thought that God's kingdom would come soon. ¹² Jesus knew the people thought this, so he told them this story. "A very important man was preparing to go to a country far away to be made king. Then the man planned to return home and rule his people. ¹³ So he called 10 of his servants together, He gave a bag of money to each servant. The man said "do business with this money until I come back"." ¹⁴ But the people in the kingdom hated the man. So the people sent a group to follow the man into another country. In the other country, this group said "We don't want that man to be our king".

15 But the man became king. When he come home, he said "Call those servants that have my money. I want to know how much more they have earned with it" ¹⁶ The 1st servant came and said "I have earned 10 bags of money with the 1 bag of money you gave me" ¹⁷ The king said to the servant "Fine! You are a good servant. I see I can trust you with small things. So now I will let you rule over 10 of my cities! ¹⁸ The 2nd servant said "Sir, with your 1 bag of money I earned 5 bags". ¹⁹ The king said to his servant, "You can rule over 5 cities!." ²⁰ Then another servant came in. The servant said to the king "Sir, here is your bag of money. I wrapped it in a piece of cloth and hid it. ²¹ I was afraid of you because you are powerful. I know you are a hard man. You even take money you didn't earn and gather food you didn't grow. ²² Then the king said to the servant, "you bad servant! I will use your own words to condemn you. You said that I am a hard man. You said that I even take money that I did not earn and gather food that I did not grow. ²³ If that is true, you should have put my money in the bank. Then, when I came back, my money would have earned some interest." ²⁴ The king said to the men that were watching. "Take the bag of money away and give it to the servant that earned 10 bags of money" ²⁵ The men said to the king, "But sir, that servant already has 10 bags of money! ²⁶ The King "The person that uses what he has will get more. But the person that does not use what he has will have everything taken away from him. ²⁷ Now where are my enemies? Where are the people that did not want me to be king? Bring my enemies here and kill them. I will watch them die!"

Study notes from New Living Translation (adapted by Michelle Smith and helped by Rev Peter Williamson)

In parables, Jesus teaches us what we need to do to be ready for his return and how to live until he comes. parable describes one part of the whole picture.

This parable is seen is similar to the parable of the Loaned Money, which we looked at in September 2018, although it is not after this parable in the bible.

In this parable is about service and obedience.

The people alive at that time hoped for a Saviour who rid them the Roman empire, Jesus' story tells us that his kingdom would not happen right away. First, he would go away for a while and he will come back later (like the king in this story). Jesus' followers would need to be faithful while he was away and keep working for God's kingdom. Even though it is now 2020, we are those people because we are waiting for Jesus to return so we need to be faithful and keep working for God's kingdom. Jesus expects us to us the talents or gifts and resources we have been given by God to increase God's kingdom. Jesus will ask each of us how we used the gifts that we have been given (judgement day at the end of the world).

Why was the king so hard on the man who had not increased his money, He did not use the talents or gifts he had to use the money wisely.

- 1) He did not share his master's interest in the kingdom.
- 2) He did not trust his master's intentions.
- 3) His only concern was for himself.
- 4) He did nothing with the money

Other thoughts about this Parable

Some things are the same as Jesus – he is going away and he will return. Then he will ask each person what they have done with their gifts or talents to increase God's kingdom (judgement day).

But I don't see he is really like the man in the story because the nobleman/king was harsh man and watched his enemies be killed. The nobleman went away to apply to be king. Jesus is not like these things. Is this more like Herod or his son?

There are 10 servants given money and the story is about 3. I see it as 3 groups of servants

- increase to 10 bags (full use of talents gifted by God)
- increase to 5 bags (some use of talents gifted by God)
- no increase (no use of talents gifted by God). At least by putting it in the bank, someone else would increase the money (using someone else's talents to increase God's kingdom).

This is a great story/Parable about using the talents we have been given. What talents has God given you?

Are you willing to use these gifts to grow God's kingdom?

If unsure that your talents are because everyone has them and they are all different, pray and ask God.
