

About missing God's targets in life and sin

The word "sin' is an old English one. It was used when archers were shooting their arrows at a target. If they missed the target the crowd would say, "sin".

So if we miss the target of the rules or laws or ideals that God has set for us we "sin".

Jesus said our two most important targets should be to love the Lord our God with all our heart, soul and strength. The second to love our neighbour as ourselves.

Parable (story) of the Good Samaritan

From Holy Bible, English Version for the Deaf

Luke 10 v 30-37


³⁰ ... Jesus said "A man was going down the road from Jerusalem to Jericho. Some robbers surrounded him. They tore his clothes and beat him. Then the robbers left the man lying on the ground. He was almost dead. ³¹ It happened that a Jewish priest was going down the road. When the priest saw the man, he did not stop to help him, he walked away ³² Next a Levite came near (Levites were men for the family group of Levi who helped the Jewish priests in the temple). The Levite saw the hurt man, but he went around him. He did not stop to help him either, he just walked away. ³³ Then a Samaritan man travelled down that road (Samaritan's came from Samaria. They were part Jewish, but the Jews would not accept them. Jews hated Samaritan's). He came to the place where the man was lying. The Samaritan saw the man. He felt sorry for the hurt man. ³⁴ The Samaritan went to him and poured olive oil and wine on his wounds (olive oil and wine were used like medicine to soften and clean wounds). Then he covered the man's wounds with a cloth. The Samaritan had a donkey. He put the hurt man on his donkey, and he took him to an inn. At the inn, the Samaritan cared for him. ³⁵ The next day, the Samaritan brought out 2 silver coins and gave them to the man who worked at the inn (One coin was a denarius, was the average pay for 1 week's work). The Samaritan said 'Take care of the hurt man. If you spend more money on him, I will pay you back when I come again'

³⁶ Then Jesus said 'Which of these 3 men, (the priest, the Levite or the Samaritan) do you think showed love to the man that was hurt by the robbers?'

³⁷ The teacher of law answered. 'The one who helped him.'

Jesus said to the man. 'Then you go and do the same (for other people).'





Study notes from New Living Translation (adapted by Michelle Smith and Rev Peter Williamson)

In parables, Jesus teaches us what we need to do to be ready for his return and how to live until he comes. parable describes one part of the whole picture.

This Parable is about working out who is your neighbour and loving your neighbour.

Maybe Jesus tells this story so the people could think of themselves as each person (the Jewish hurt man, the Priest, the Levite and the Samaritan). Jewish people hated the Samaritan people and I think it would be very hard to accept help from a person you did not like. And the hated Samaritan looked after the Jewish hurt man just like you would think the Priest or the Levite would (but didn't).

God's law says we are to love our neighbour. Of the 3 people in the story (the Priest, the Levite and the Samaritan), we would expect the Priest or the Levite to help because they are people of God and follow God's laws and they are the same religion as the hurt man. The person we don't expect to help is the Samaritan because they were different – they hated Jews.

Jesus teaches us there are 3 important things to loving your neighbour

- 1. Lack of love is easy to do but is never right.
- 2. Who is our neighbour? Anyone of any race or social background (family or personal history or place in society) that is in need.
- 3. Love means doing something to meet another person's need. Where ever you live, there are always needy people nearby to help. A person's need can be for you to meet and talk or they need something done for them or both.
