

A letter of encouragement to each of us. The Bible talks about different seasons in life. We are in a season of change due to COVID 19 & the Delta variety/strain which is now all over the world.

• We all know how each one of us is being affected. We need to pray (ask God) to help us get through these hard times. I ask God to specially help us with our moods, patience, worries, stress and how we talk/act when we are around other people. Please God help us be sensitive with people In Jesus holy & precious name Amen.

Here in NZ we are soon changing to the "Traffic light system", this system replaces the current COVID19 alert level system. This new way means going from preventing COVID virus, to managing life with the virus in our community. We all know how level 4 & 3 has affected us especially in Auckland. The government is promising no more lockdowns like in level 4 or 3. We need more than 90% of all NZ vaccinated to start.. We are getting a lot closer to the 90% needed. This is called herd immunity, it means if we are vaccinated and do get COVID we will not get as sick as people who have had the virus and who have not had any COVID vaccinations. Health authorities around the World are now telling us we need another " booster vaccination" in 6 months from our 2^{nd} vaccination.

Please look at the date when you had yr 2nd COVID vaccination. BOOSTERS are starting to be given in NZ. from November 29th this yr. People need to book in for their booster vaccination locally at least 6 months from that date.

Adults everywhere in NZ. have to wear masks when you leave home and go out eg. to public places. You do not have to wear a mask when eating or drinking or when we have health or disability reason for not wearing a mask.

If we cannot wear a mask because we are Deaf and need to lipread/ communicate as we need to ask people to take their mask down & face us while they speak. Remember we need to stay 2metres away from other people & try to put yr mask on while they talk or communicate with you it reduces the risk of passing viruses around.

Deaf people can apply for COVID mask exemption card (permission not to wear mask all the time) through Deaf Aotearoa. You need to have that card with you when you are out in public. It is a voluntary card at the moment.

Remember in the Bible (book of Exodus). God told Moses to lead Gods chosen people (Israelites = people from Israel) through the desert, they were living and travelling without a place to call it home. They lived where other countries rulers/kingdoms and Governments ruled over them, where they got their food, the type of work they could do & where they could live. Rules changed lots of times & they had to obey laws

God tells us we need to obey the laws of places where we are living.





Please know the committee and I are praying for each person who have been or are part of Auckland Deaf Christian Fellowship.

I am sorry we have not been able to visit You for a very long time. We don't have special letter saying any of us are essential workers.

At the moment we cant really meet face to face until we do not have to wear masks or that we can meet safely outside and stay at least 2 metres away from each other. We are waiting to hear when ADCF can meet together again.

I know I struggle like many people and have found these last 2 and half yrs hard too. Please pray for people in Retirement villages, Private Hospitals and Rest Homes who have not been able to leave where they live and have not been allowed any visitors.


If you need more information about COVID please ask other people or if you need help to understand any new rules please contact Deaf Aotearoa.
