This reading is from the Holy Bible, English Version for the Deaf (purple cover)

Psalms 37(David's song) verse 1 – 11 and 37 – 40 (below)

- 1/ Don't get upset at evil people. Don't be jealous of people who do bad things.
- 2/ Evil people are like grass and green plants that quickly turn brown and die.
- 3/ If you trust in the Lord and do good things, you will live and enjoy many things the land gives.
- 4/ Enjoy serving the Lord and he will give you what you want.
- 5/ Depend on the Lord. Trust him, and he will do what must be done.
- 6/ Let your goodness and fairness shine like the sun at noon.
- 7/ Trust in the Lord and wait for his help. Don't be upset when bad people succeed. Don't be upset when bad people make evil plans and their plans succeed.
- 8/ Don't be angry! Don't be mad! Don't become so upset you want too to do bad things.
- 9/ Why? Because evil people will be destroyed. But people that call the Lord for help will get the land God has promised.
- 10/ In a short time, there will be no more evil people. You can look for these people but they will be gone!

- 37/ Be pure and honest, because that brings peace.
- 38/ But people who break the law will be destroyed.
- 39/ The Lord saves good people. When good people have troubles, the Lord is their strength.
- 40/ The Lord helps good people and saves them. Good people depend on the Lord, and he saves them from bad people.

If you have any problems with them (bad people), just ignore them. Anger, rage and losing your temper are very destructive (negative or damaging or bad) emotions. They show a lack of faith (you don't believe) that God is in control and God loves us. Don't forget that what our Lord Jesus Christ says, "So my dear brothers and sisters, stand strong. Don't let anything change you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord. You know that your work in the Lord is never wasted.

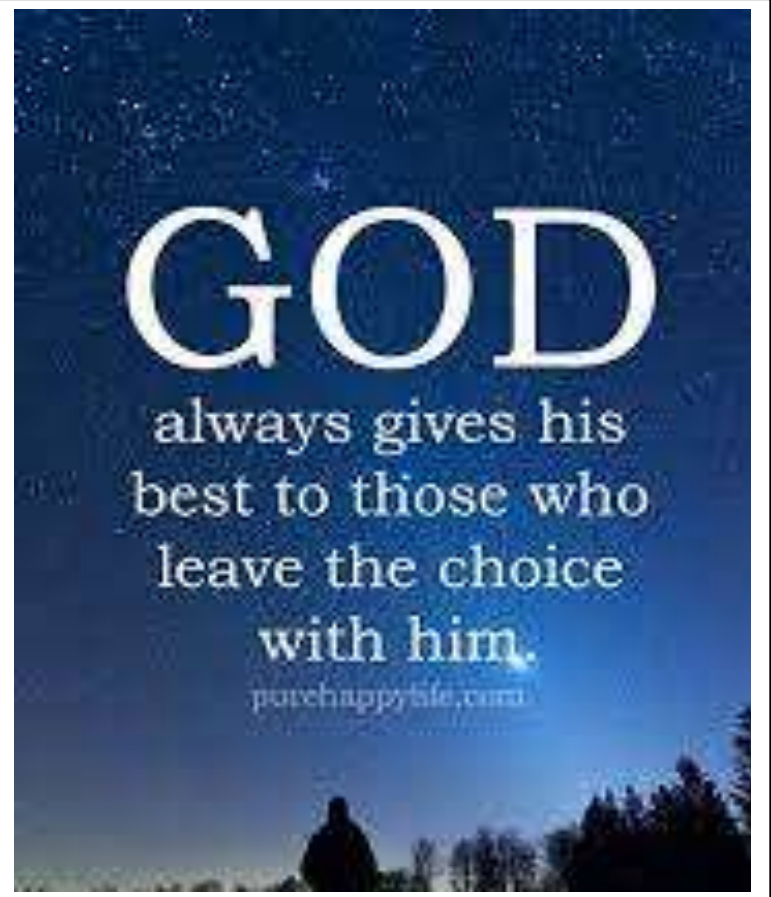

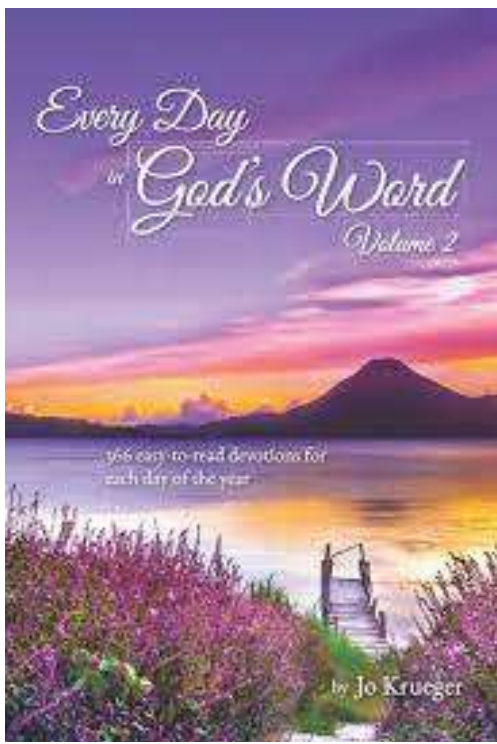

In the Bible Paul who was in prison starts most of his letters to other Christians/followers of God. like this "

Paul prays "everytime i think of you, I thank my God. Everytime i pray for all of you, it makes me happy to know you believe in Jesus. Paul went through some very hard times in his life and God sent some others to help him. Paul knew God had sent these people to help him. We can thank God even when we may not feel like it. God knows the difficulties each of us in our lives & sends others to encourage and help us.
