

Lynette (Michelle's Mum) – pray for healing after her recent surgery.


People who had problems with the recent flooding – pray that they can rebuild their lives quickly.

I started off looking into why we have shrove Tues and the tradition of pancakes. I found it was similar to the Jewish tradition of using up left overs before Ash Wednesday in the traditional churches and looked a bit further into the season of Lent. I thought I would share this with you.

Season of Lent

The key events of Lent include Ash Wednesday, <u>Maundy Thursday</u>, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday.

The start of Lent is on <u>Ash Wednesday</u>, many Christians get a cross on their foreheads from the ashes during a church service. The ashes symbolize grief and the acceptance of our sinful nature.

<u>Maundy Thursday</u> is the day before Jesus is crucified. It is believed to be the day Jesus celebrated <u>Passover</u> with his disciples and washed their feet as a display of humility and love.

<u>Good Friday</u> is the day we remember the crucifixion and death of Jesus on the cross. It is called "good" because it is part of God's plan for our salvation. God's good plan to redeem us from sin included the suffering of Jesus.

<u>Easter Sunday</u> is the most important day in Christian history. Three days after his death, we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Jesus rose again, conquering death. Through Jesus. We have the opportunity to have continuous (eternal) forgiveness for our sins, relationship with God, and forever (eternity) in Heaven.
