



It is with sadness that we advise that according to our constitution (for the Charities Commission)

 We don't have active involvement of an ordained Minister or Church (eg Presbyterian, Methodist or Anglican).

ADCF will close after the service on 1 June 2025.

There will be a 55th celebration meal on June 28.


